Exhibition & Storytelling February 2012

OurStory Scotland is holding an exhibition and two storytelling events at St Mungo Museum in Glasgow during LGBT History Month 2012. LGBT History Month celebrates the history of the LGBT (lesbian, gay, bisexual & transgender) Community.

exhibition

Love Out of Bounds is an exhibition for the whole of LGBT History Month, February 2012, at St Mungo Museum in Glasgow. The exhibition celebrates love stories that have been hidden, ignored or rejected because of someone's sexuality, culture or faith. The images and stories in the exhibition are the result of an innovative storytelling project that finds common ground between many communities and includes contributions from straight and LGBT people. The exhibition is accompanied by two storytelling events: Supporting Stars at 2pm on 4th February and Loves Untold at 6pm on 14th February.

storytelling and collecting stories

Supporting Stars will take place at 2pm on Saturday 4 February at St Mungo Museum in Glasgow. It is an event that encourages us to talk about the heroes and heroines of LGBT History, from those who have helped to change our world for the better, to those who have given us invaluable personal support. We shall be sharing stories of people, past and present, who have given support to the LGBT community and to those whose love has been deemed 'out of bounds'. Whose memory would you like to celebrate? Bring along any photos or memories of someone you know who has supported you or other LGBT people, or just come along and listen to stories of Supporting Stars.

storytelling performance

Loves Untold is a storytelling performance at 6pm on Valentine's Day, 14 February, at St Mungo Museum in Glasgow. The performance includes stories that have been collected during a series of storytelling workshops on Love Out of Bounds, an innovative project that crosses the boundaries between communities and brings us together to share stories of loves untold. We are finding common ground between straight and LGBT people, and people from majority and minority ethnic communities, telling stories of loves ignored or rejected by their family, community, culture or faith. All are welcome to attend this storytelling performance and will get an opportunity to ask the exhibition organisers about the images and texts in the exhibition. For those who wish to share their own tale of Love Out of Bounds, there will also be opportunities to tell, write or record their story.
